Baddow Camera Club are pleased to announce the fourth Chelmsford City Photo Marathon.

12 Subjects in 6 hours – Are you up to the challenge?

In 2016 over 100 photographers from across Essex registered for the challenge. 2017 is set to be a bigger and better event.

Both the 'starting line' and the 'finishing line' will be Remembrance Square, Chelmsford Library – with plenty of parking in the adjacent multi-storey car park and easy access by public transport from both the train and bus stations that are 5 minutes' walk away.

Start 10am sharp and finish 4pm latest.

The competition is open to ALL camera enthusiasts (whether you belong to a club or not) – and will consist of taking 12 photographs representing the subjects set by the judges. Empty memory cards will be checked at the start and then will be received at the finish line with ONLY 12 photos representing the 12 subjects.

Entry paid on the day will be £5 (£4 for students – ID will be checked!) – With winners in all 12 categories, a TROPHY and £200 worth of PRIZES up for grabs!

Photo Marathons:

Based on an idea first introduced in Cardiff. This will be the fourth year the event has taken place in Chelmsford. The aim of the challenge is creative photography without the need for computer based post processing. Participants will only be allowed to submit a memory card at the end of the 6 hour period with one image per subject (12 in total) Participants are encouraged from young to old and all types of cameras including mobile phones that have memory cards.
